Today, SUBWAY is the world's largest submarine sandwich chain with more than 37,000 locations around the world. (Doctor's Associates Inc.)

The company headquarters is located in Milford, Connecticut, with additional regional and country offices, employing about 1,000 people in total. Worldwide, its franchisees provide more than 300,000 jobs in the communities where they are located.

Their goal is to be ranked the number one Quick Service Restaurant (QSR) worldwide.

B.M.T stands for Biggest, Meatiest, and Tastiest. In the early days of SUBWAY restaurants, it was a promotion that was based on the Brooklyn Manhattan Transit system in New York City that went along with the subway theme.

SUBWAY is involved with civic, educational, and charitable organizations such as the United Way, March of Dimes, Habitat for Humanity, and Junior Achievement. They also partner with the American Heart Association and the American Red Cross on initiatives such as sodium reduction. They are involved with schools, religious and community organizations.
